#### "History of the American Flag"

Mr. Rudy Mummey of Lewisburg (left) has been a flag collector, also known as a vexillologist, for 68 years. An owner of more than 1,900 flags and with an avid interest in their history, symbolism and usage, Mr. Mummey will present a program "History of the American Flag" at the next meeting of Eagle Grange on Tuesday, June 4, 2024.

#### **Financial Support Coming**

A couple officers of Eagle Grange have been working behind the scenes for several months to apply for and follow up on grants that would help us reach the long awaited goal to install insulation and maintenace-free siding to the exterior of the Grange Hall. In fact, a discussion about this project first appeared in the Grange minutes during the early 1970's and several more times years thereafter, but limited financial resourses always prevented the completion of this much needed improvement.

Now it appears we are nearing the successful completion of fund raising that will move this project across the finish line! At the June 4<sup>th</sup> meeting, officials from Clinton Township will present \$10,000 to support the project and officials from Brady Township will make a \$1,000 gift. Two other donations totalling \$5,500 have been commtted and will be received shortly. With available funds in the Grange treasury, we have now raised about two-thirds of the \$34,309 cost of the work. Several other likely funding sources are still to be confirmed.

Any individual, business or group that wishes to make a tax-deductible contribution may do so by routing funds through the PA State Grange Foundation which then transfers those funds to Eagle Grange under the "historical preservation" provisions of the Foundation's trust declarations filed with and approved by the IRS.
